


#### **SOLOMON SMILES PROJECT**

#### **RAWCS No 3 - 2024/25**

**Solomon Smiles** is a project registered with RAWCS to provide dental services to the East Solomons Province of Makira. It is directed by club member Som-Ling Leung as Project Manager assisted by Graham McHugh as Deputy Project Manager and sponsored by the Rotary club of Mooloolaba under the terms set out in the registration document issued by RAWCS. Essentially, the responsibility of the club is to support the project, to ensure that expenditure meets the guidelines set out by RAWCS and to audit the 6-monthy expenditure

returns required by RAWCS. The project application was supported by President Ian, the DG and the National Manager Projects RAWCS.





Building a new clinic was proposed by Dr. Lenstar Hageata, Senior Provincial Dental Officer Makira-Ulawa province with support from the local government member. This new clinic will not only allow another dentist to join Dr. Lenstar, but also help him provide quality care and boost local health professionals services with properly equipped and climate resilient clinics. The following up volunteer exchange programmes will have sustainable impact to his people.

# Background

- . Makira Province is the fourth largest province in the country
- . Approx 60,000 people mainly around Kirakira the capital
- . No dentist has stayed for more than 18 months due to:
  - Ø Poor / unrepairable equipment
  - Ø Inadequate facilities
  - Ø Infrequent outreach to other areas in the province
  - Ø Cost and time to travel to Honiara for dental services not available at Kirakira

## PROJECT OUTLINE

- · Build a modern dental clinic at Kirakira with two surgeries, allowance for a third, a sterilization room, office / reception, storage room and waiting area
- · Provide second hand equipment and instruments appropriate to Solomon Islands requirements
- · Provide training and ongoing maintenance support to ensure the longevity of the equipment

# **OBJECTIVES**

- · Increase / improve the quality of dental services and infection control
- · Increase the range of dental services that can be provided by improving the existing facilities and attracting suitable qualified dental personnel
- · Improve the retention of these personnel

## **TIMELINE**

A number of activities have been initiated in 2024:

- . Develop and refine budget Completed
- . Secure commitment and funding from stakeholders Completed
- . Define roles and responsibilities Completed
- . Develop an MOU with Provincial Government Completed
- · Source second hand dental equipment Victoria, Newcastle, Hong Kong
- · Prefabricate dental clinic in Brisbane Completed

# The next phase involves:

- . Provincial government allocating a site and connecting utilities
- . Transport container BNE Honiara and then to Kirakira Unload container to secure location
- · Build clinic in Kirakira
  - · Install dental equipment
  - · Provide training in equipment and maintenance

Evaluation of the project will involve evaluation of equipment and service by Australian Bio Medical technician and dental assistant practice protocols for equipment, maintenance and infection controls

# Hello Everyone,

For those members who are not aware, ECOKAPS is an organization that supplies ecologically responsible products to a global market, upholding their philosophy that businesses must take ownership and responsibility for care of the environment.

To this end they have developed a range of dissolvable household cleaning and personal use products using eco-friendly ingredients, brought to market in a concentrated form. This concentrated product is then diluted with water in the home in reusable bottles.

The concentrated form requires far less volume/space and therefore saves on packaging materials thus significantly reducing the production and use of single use plastics and shipping space. (According to ECOKAPS, the concentrated form uses approximately 37 times less shipping space thus reducing shipping costs, and carbon emissions.)

**BUSINESS NETWORK REFERRAL OPPORTUNITY:** With the approval of D9620, Mooloolaba Rotary has created a "Business Network Referral Opportunity" that is designed to leverage off Rotarian's business contacts to find potential distributors/retailers of ECOKAPS products.

In addition to achieving the shared objective of protecting the environment, ECOKAPS has undertaken to donate 5% of the sales to any new distributor/ retailer arising from a business referral to the referring member's Rotary Club for the benefit of their local communities.

if successful, Rotary will be instrumental in significantly reducing sidle-use plastics both locally and internationally, whilst at the same time, raising funds for worthy environmental organisations/charities

WHAT CAN YOU DO: Look for an opportunity in Supplier and Distribution companies and larger retailing outlets who might be interested in ECOKAPS products. Is there anyone in your business, social or other networks whom you may be able to contact regarding the opportunity?

The idea is to expand the project nationally and eventually, internationally so it would be great if we could have one local 'success' story.

The club has tailored letters of introduction, and these must be used as part of the engagement process with the potential distributor/retailer. Once interest is established the contact is referred to ECOKAPS for direct business dealings. Members are not involved.

We received 24 apologies.


